

Japanese Honeysuckle



Japanese honeysuckle is an escaped landscape planting that originated in Asia. It grows aggressively in thickets, taking over habitat.

It is shown here growing between multiflora rose.



The leaves are simple and occur oppositely along the hairy stems. Note the gray coloration of the stems due to the presence of dense, short hairs.

Flowers. Flowers are usually white, but may sometimes be yellow or pink. They have a fragrant aroma.

Life cycle: perennial.
